AMENDMENT 31 PROPOSED UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION

- **Section 1:** The Right of the People to Privacy is fundamental to their freedom; neither the United States nor any State, nor private citizen, or citizens organized against any person, shall violate or abridge a person's right to privacy.
- **Section 2:** The use of public spaces, to violate a person's fundamental right to privacy, except by duly ordered Court Warrant, pursuant to the 4th and 14th Amendments particularity demands, shall be subject to criminal misdemeanor charges and private civic lawsuit on a preponderance of the evidence standard.
- **Section 3:** All previous Supreme Court rulings implying limitations to the People's Right to Privacy in public spaces which shall be below the standard of section 2 of this Amendment, are hereby repealed and nullified by ratification of this Amendment.
- **Section 4:** The Congress shall have the power to enforce this amendment by appropriate legislation.
